The things he had for his own use and comfort are comparatively simple and inexpensive, in accordance with his rugged tastes. But his collection of gifts, souvenirs and trophies, aside from their intrinsic value, represent a variety of wealth and effect.

At Sagamore Hill is a pair of elephant tusks, 107 inches long, presented to Colonel Roosevelt by Emperor Menelik, valued at \$3,000; another pair of tusks, sixty-three inches in length, from an elephant shot by the ex-President himself; mounted heads of lions, bears, deer, antelopes and buffalo, horns of a two-horned rhinoceros and other relics of the chase, all brought down by his bronze, pottery, books and manuscripts presented to him in Europe by sovereign and subject, and a store of grateful remembrances given him from among his

own people. There are dozens of gifts presented to "Colonel" or "President" Roosevelt, and he had hundreds of autographed books, some of which were dedicated to him and others of which are biographies and impressions of his life and work. There are, of course, many books of his own, some of which are translated into several languages. His versatility included an artistic sense, for he had of paintings, etchings, water colors, bronzes, vases, porcelains, plate and rare ivory carvings.
