## A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS, the Diamond Mountain Forest Reserve, in the State of California, was established by proclamation dated July fourteenth, nineteen hundred and five;

Diamond Mountain Forest Reserve, in the State tain Forest Reserve, Cal. Preamble, Aste, p. 3113.

And whereas, it appears that the public good would be promoted by adding to the said forest reserve certain lands, within the State of

California, which are in part covered with timber; And whereas, it is provided by the Act of Congress, approved June fourth, eighteen hundred and ninety-seven, entitled, "An Act Making appropriations for sundry civil expenses of the Government for the fiscal year ending June thirtieth, eighteen hundred and ninety-eight, and for other purposes," that "The President is hereby authorized at any time to modify any Executive order that has been or may

hereafter be made establishing any forest reserve, and by such modification may reduce the area or change the boundary lines of such reserve, or may vacate altogether any order creating such reserve "

Now, therefore, I, Theodore Roosevelt, President of the United larged. States of America, by virtue of the power in me vested by the said act of Congress, do proclaim that the aforesaid Diamond Mountain Forest Reserve is hereby enlarged to include the said additional lands, and that the boundaries of the reserve are now as shown on the diagram forming a part hereof.

This proclamation will not take effect upon any lands withdrawn or reserved, at this date, from settlement, entry, or other appropriation, for any purpose other than forest uses, or which may be covered by any prior valid claim, so long as the withdrawal, reservation, or claim exists.

Warning is hereby given to all persons not to make settlement upon Reserved from settlement. the lands reserved by this proclamation.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the seal of the United States to be affixt.

Done at the City of Washington this 15th day of October, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and six, and of the Independence of the United States the one hun-SEAL. dred and thirty-first.
