

COLONEL WOULD LEAD A DIVISION IN FRANCE

**Says He Will Have It There in
Five Months, if Govern-
ment Gives Permission.**

JACKSONVILLE, Fla., March 24.—Theodore Roosevelt, in an address here today, said he would have a division of American soldiers in the trenches of France within four or five months, if permission were given by the Government.

The statement was made just after the band had played "Dixie," and Colonel Roosevelt had remarked, "I would like to hear that tune against von Hindenburg's line in France."

The Colonel said the United States should carry the war to Germany. He pleaded for universal military training. Colonel Roosevelt departed today for Fort Myer to hunt devilfish.
